

The Seacoast Road Race Series is comprised of eight unique races. They have joined forces to promote running for sport, fun and fitness, and the beauty of running on the Seacoast.

A special feature of these races is that each one is a fundraiser for a local non-profit, so your race entry fees help each organization achieve its goals.

See for yourself...

The Children's Museum of New Hampshire's Annual 5K Road Race and Kid-venture Course raises funds to help provide free access to the museum for all families who visit and supports critical programming at the museum. Now in its 33rd year, race day includes a challenging 5k course for all ages, a Kid-venture Course with silly challenges for kids ages 1-12, prizes, giveaways, great food, face painting and much more.

The Runner's Alley / Redhook Memorial 5K Road Race is a festive 5K that donates 100% of all proceeds to Krempels Center, a Portsmouth, NH-based nonprofit, supporting individuals living with acquired brain injury. Over the years, the race has netted over \$500,000 in support of Krempels Center and the programs and services they offer to their members.

Each year, **Pro Portsmouth's Market Square Day 10K Road Race** kicks off the festival of the same name. Monies raised through the race assist in funding Pro Portsmouth's program of Downtown events held throughout the year. In addition to Market Square Day, Pro Portsmouth produces First Night, Children's Day and Summer in the Street; all are free to the public.

The Amidon Family Dentistry York Days 5K is a race sponsored by Amidon Family Dentistry and is administered by the Town of York Parks and Recreation Department. All proceeds support Parks and Recreation Department community youth programming.

Where does the time go? This year, **The Saunders at Rye Harbor 10K** will celebrate its 42nd anniversary. The Saunders race supports the programs of the NHSPCA.

The Fox Point Sunset 5 Mile Road Race supports enrichment activities for the students of the Newington Public School. Through the Newington School Supporters, the race proceeds help fund annual Artist-in-Residence programs, technology, music, as well as support for the Destination Imagination teams and a yearly scholarship.

The Great Island 5K is involved a variety of causes on the Seacoast including: funding the Dr. Thomas W. Quinn Scholarships (\$4,000 per year) for graduating HS seniors, financial support of the Portsmouth Track and Cross Country Booster Club, the maintenance and expansion of the Great Island Common Playground and Great Island Skating Rink as well as support for the Maude H. Trefethen Elementary School and Rye JH track teams.

The Great Bay 5K is a fundraiser for the Great Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve and the Great Bay Discovery Center, located on the shores of Great Bay in Greenland. Financial support from the race assists efforts to improve the health of Great Bay, and funds programs and capital improvements at the Great Bay Discovery Center.
